Healing and Holy Communion service led by Revd Anna Bishop

Anna says:

"During the service prayers and anointing for healing will be offered for anybody who wants this prayer. It is offered to anybody and everybody, but is entirely optional - we know that for some it will be an important experience, but for others it will not feel appropriate or meaningful. We aim to offer a service that gives respectful space to all, however you wish to respond to the offer.

You will not be asked to share any personal information or private details, but there will be an opportunity to talk in confidence after the service if there is anything you wish to explore further.

Healing always reaches beyond just one individual and so you are welcome to request prayer and anointing for somebody else. If you are doing so, you might find it helpful to bring to the service an object that belongs to that person or that represents them or a certain situation. Please remember to ask their permission first. If you are worshipping with us online you might like to place your object in front of you along with the elements you have prepared for Holy Communion.

If you are worshipping online, please know that you are included in the prayers for healing, just as you are included in the celebration of Holy Communion. If you would like to receive anointing for healing, please get in touch with me and we can make arrangements."
